*THE PROFESSION OF FAITH: THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ His only Son, our Lord;

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead and buried;

He descended into Hell;

the third day He rose again from the dead;

He ascended into Heaven,

and is seated on the right hand of God, the Father Almighty;

from there He shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

Amen.

(Note: Although not written by the apostles, this creed is a summary of their teachings. Though its origin is traced to the second century, it developed into its present form by the sixth or seventh century. For the sake of clarity, please note that we believe that Jesus suffered the agony and punishment of Hell on the cross, most especially when He knew that He had been forsaken by His Father, and that He died a real death from which He was resurrected. We believe also that "holy catholic church" refers to the church universal.)

THE PRAYERS OF CONFESSION

All: Our Father, we think of all that You have done for us in Christ Jesus, our Lord: You have joined us with Him in His death, that by faith in Him we are freed from sin's penalty. You have joined us with Him in His resurrection, that by faith in Him we are freed from sin's power to live in newness of life. Yet, we confess that we often find ourselves living as if still enslaved to sin, still under sin's guilt and authority. Slow to seek forgiveness, reluctant to receive guidance from your word and strength from your Spirit, we fail to live as those born of your Spirit. Forgive our pride that causes us to trust in ourselves; forgive our selfishness that causes us to look out for ourselves and neglect others; forgive our self-righteousness that causes us to forget our need for you. Restore to us the clear conscience that comes from knowing sins forgiven, the peace that comes from knowing to you, and the joy that comes from pleasing you, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

PRIVATE (A time of silent and private confessions for personal sins)

LEADER: If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. (Romans 10:9-13)

*THE RESPONSIVE READING OF CHRIST'S RESURRECTION: 1 Corinthians 15:1-8, 11

LEADER: Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you— unless you believed in vain.

ALL: For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.
